During her three-year tenure, Litvak has guided Allens Lane through a period of significant growth and innovation, strengthening programs, expanding community partnerships, and reaffirming the Center's commitment to making the arts accessible to all. The Board of Directors expresses deep gratitude for her tireless dedication and visionary leadership.

"As I begin a new chapter, my heart is full of gratitude for your trust and for all this community has taught me. I look forward to seeing the continued magic and shared spirit of this essential cultural beacon in the years to come."

To ensure a smooth and thoughtful transition, Michael Williamson will serve as Interim Executive Director. Williamson brings decades of experience as an educator and arts leader, including a long tenure at Germantown Friends School, where he taught art and art history and held numerous leadership roles. Williams also has deep roots in the community, a Mt. Airy native who attended Allens Lane programs as a young student.

"I am thrilled to join Allens Lane as Interim Executive Director and to support the staff, artists, educators, and students who make this community so vibrant," said Michael Williamson, Interim Executive Director at the Center. "Allens Lane has been a cornerstone of creativity and connection in Mt. Airy for many decades, and I am excited to help continue its legacy while learning from and working alongside this remarkable team."

"Building on Vita's incredible work over the past three years and Allens Lane's 72-year legacy, Michael brings a wealth of experience, steady leadership, and a passion for the arts, making him an ideal guide for the Center during this transition," said Susan Matyas, Board President of Allens Lane Art Center. Vita Litvak's last day is November 24th, and Michael Williamson will begin supporting the Center's operations this week. The Center's search for a permanent Executive Director will begin in the new year.
